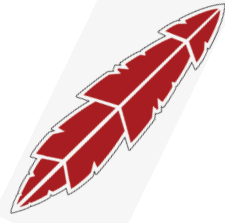

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Local Man Killed in Crash

On Wednesday, October 22, 2025 the Ohio State Patrol was called for an accident that occurred at CR 205 and CR 312 around 3:30 p.m. in Groton Township, Erie County, OH. The driver Bridget Strecker, 32, Bellevue, was driving a 2018 XT5 Cadillac when she failed to yield at a stop sign on CR 205. Steven Hay, 74, Bellevue, was driving a 2000 Chevrolet S10 that struck the Cadillac causing both vehicles to travel off the roadway. Hay was transported to Bellevue Hospital where he was confirmed deceased by the medical staff. Strecker was transported to Firelands Regional Medical Center for unknown injuries. No charges have been filed, and the accident remains under investigation.

Nature Walk Bird Talk
