School has begun, and along comes homework, reading assignments, and listening to lectures with writing on the board in front of the classroom. Sometimes, this is the time when a child will struggle with learning because of a problem in their eyesight that has gone undiagnosed. That's when the Global Cause of "Sight" comes into play for the Lions Clubs. For the Attica Lions Club, under the chairperson of Lion Bob Featheringill, phone calls and meetings with school officials are lined up to schedule early detection of vision impairments in school children.

The Attica Lions volunteers visited the schools in September, this year with Seneca East, Monroeville, IHC and SE Preschools, and Celeryville schools' grades

pre-K-5. Special vision testing machines are used which are highly accurate at alerting if a child's eyes need to be referred to an eye doctor for further diagnosis. Eventually, the prescription of glasses may be done so that the child can continue to learn better, because now they can see! Following the decree of Helen Keller 100 years ago, to invite the Lions Clubs to be her "Knights of the Blind," Lions clubs continue to screen youngsters early for vision problems, collect used eyeglasses, and deliver these to underdeveloped and needy countries.
